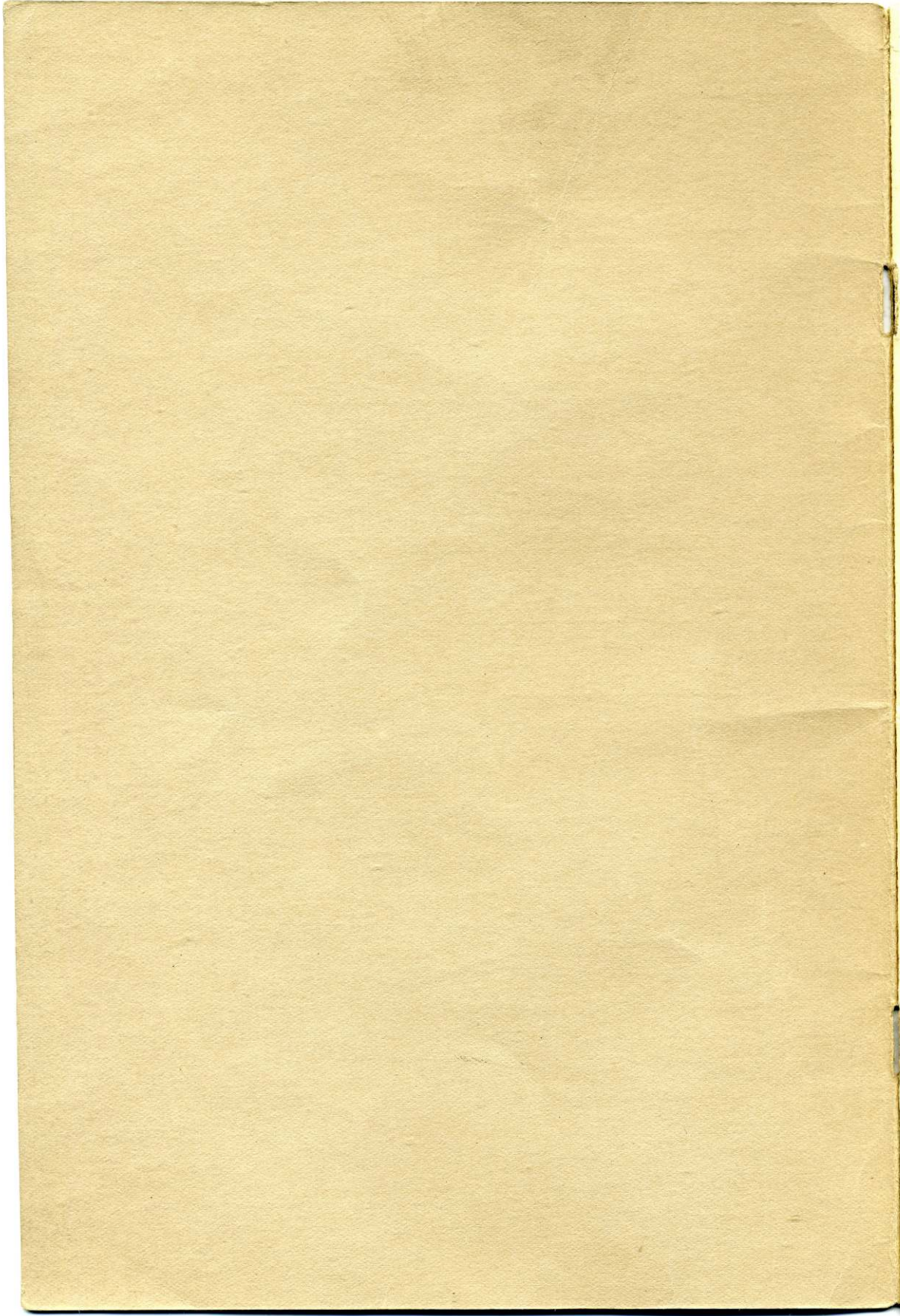

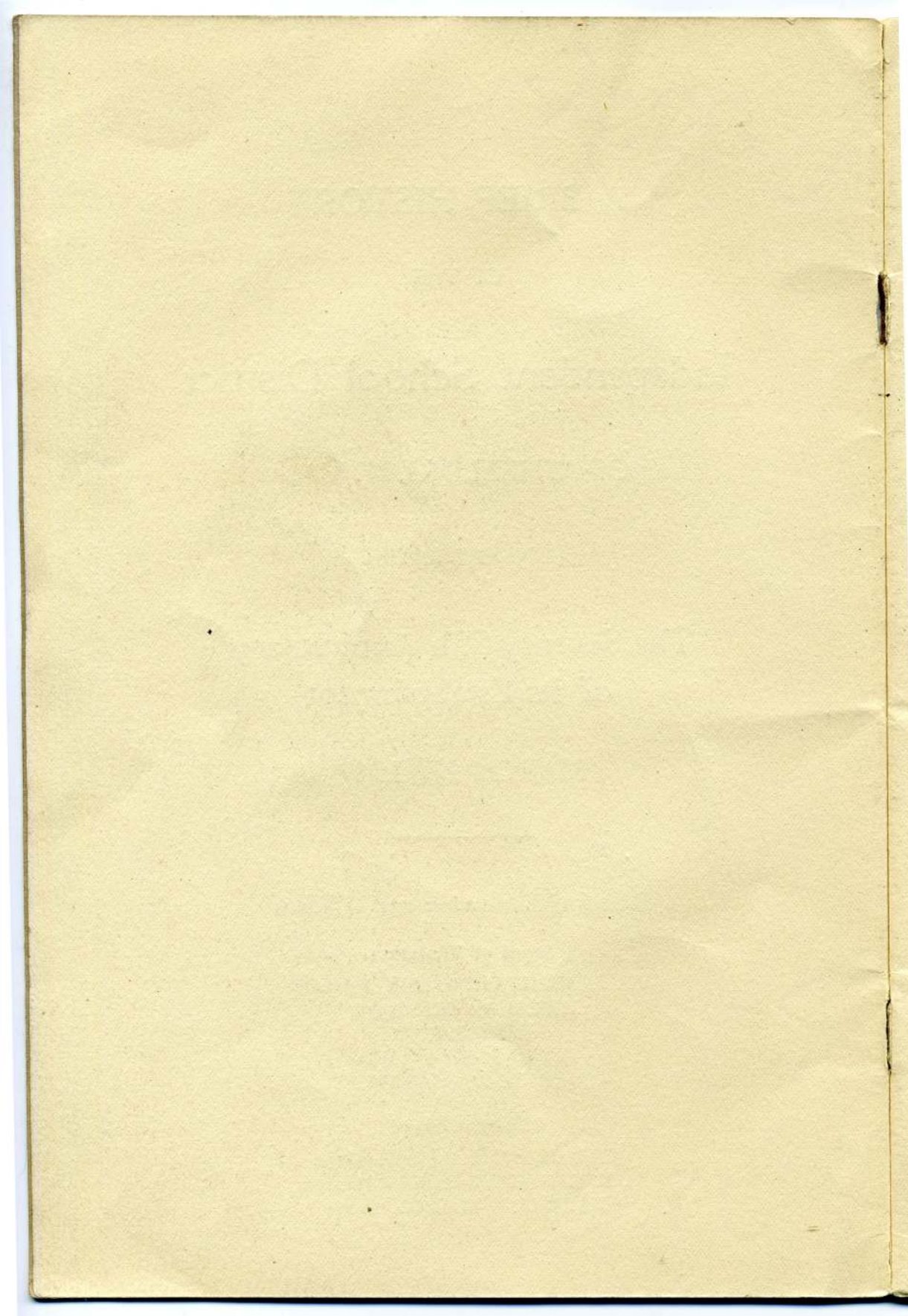

HISTORY OF THE WHEELING PUBLIC SCHOOLS

March 24, 1924

"Pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Virginia entitled 'An Act Concerning District Public Schools in the County of Ohio,' passed February 23, 1849, the Clerk of the City of Wheeling, whose duty it became under the law aforesaid, issued a writ for an election to be held on the fourth Monday in March, 1849, for one School Commissioner and two Trustees for each ward in said city," etc.

So reads the minutes of the Wheeling Board of Education under the date of March 27, 1849, and accordingly, the one Commissioner and two Trustees for each of the five wards assumed their duties April 7, 1849, thus really giving each ward, afterward called School Sub-Districts, a membership of three, which number obtained for the following seventy-four years, when in May, 1923, a Board consisting of five members elected at large and on a non-partisan basis succeeded a Board of 21 members.

The five Commissioners elected in 1849 were:

These members were to continue in office until January 1, 1850. Morgan Nelson was named as President and George W. Sights as Clerk. They immediately appointed the trustees for each of the five wards as follows:

A Board to hold periodical examination of teachers was appointed consisting of: Dr. A. S. Todd, Rev. William Wallace, Rev. Cyrus Dickson, John I. Hoge, Esq., any three of whom were authorized to act.

The Board in 1851 was: Morgan Nelson, President, Wm. S. Wickham, Michael Sweeney, John Gilchrist, and Chester D. Hubbard, who together with 12 Trustees carried on the work of the schools.

The population of Wheeling at this time was 11,413 and the School Budget \$6,430.70, being about 56 cents per capita, as compared with \$15.00 per capita in 1922-23. The enrollment, however, of 2,844 being about one in four of the population, is above the present proportion of the average city at the present time. In 1836 with a population of 13,333, the school enrollment 3,423, thus maintaining the ratio of four to one.

The minutes are silent as to the number of teachers in these early years but from other records the number is said to be somewhat in excess of thirty.

The course was one of twelve years as at present, and the studies of the last four years as adopted September 2, 1851, were: Chemistry, Physics, Astronomy, Geography of the Heavens, Physiology, Geometry, Botany, History, Wayland's Moral Science, Rhetoric, Old and New Testament, Bookkeeping, and Watts on the Mind. The dictionary for reference was Webster's and Vocal Music was added the next year.

The term of school began the first Monday of September and extended to the second Friday of July, a period of ten months, not including the Christmas holidays. School opened at 9:00 with "the reading some portion of the Old and the New Testament Scriptures," closed at 12:00. The afternoon session began at 1:30 P. M. and extended to 4:30 P. M. But from October to April, the afternoon session was from 1:00 P. M. to 4:00 P. M.

At the beginning of school in September, 1849, finding that the school levy would not be sufficient to meet expenses, it was ordered that each pupil, or as many of them as might be considered necessary, pay a sum not exceeding one dollar per quarter toward the support of the schools. This tuition did not obtain very long as the levy was increased sufficiently to meet the expenditures, and we find the Budget for 1851 was \$8,707.42 as contrasted with that of \$6,430.70 of 1849.

On February 8, 1851, the Board is on record as buying Lots 5 and 6 at the corner of Fourth and Centre Streets at a cost of \$2,900.00 as a site for a High School. Five per cent. of this sum, \$145.00, was ordered to be borrowed and paid as the first installment of this purchase. At the August meeting in 1852 a resolution was passed asking the Board of Trustees of the Lancastrian Academy, later Linsly Institute, to petition the Legislature to

authorize the Trustees of this Academy to convey and transfer all the real and personal property, moneys, and credits of that Institution to the Board of Commissioners of the City of Wheeling for the purpose of establishing a Central Public High School, authorized by the Act of Assembly February 23, 1849, the school to be established upon the grounds then occupied by the Academy.

The response of the Trustees of the Academy, not being favorable to transfer of their property to the Public School System, the Board in 1852 made a proposition for the lease of the grounds. This also was rejected by the Linsly trustees.

The Board, however, in 1857, insistent upon the assistance of the Academy, asked for an arrangement by which the funds of that institution could be used in conjunction with Public School Funds in establishing a High School. This also was ineffective. Not disheartened by this third failure, we find that in 1865 a final effort was made for leasing the Linsly Building, but made in vain and the High School subject lay quiescent for thirty-two years, for in 1897 the Maxwell property on which the Public Library is located, was bought for \$20,000.00, the building remodeled and additions made, and the school organized in September, 1897. The building, however, was inadequate for conducting the work of the school, the enrollment of which was gradually increasing, and arrangements were made for a new building, resulting in the completion, in 1909, of a building on the site of the present building.

This building was ordinarily well adapted for the needs of the school at that time and was in use but four years when, in 1913, a disastrous fire destroyed the interior of the building and damaged the walls. In rebuilding some changes and additions were made and the building was opened in September, 1915.

Since the organization of the High School in 1897 gradual changes have been made as to the curricula so that at present the courses offered are: Classical, General, Commercial, Industrial Arts and Household Arts. Rated as a first class school, its graduates are admitted on diploma to all these institutions of high learning, on a par with other first class high schools of the country. Meanwhile the school has almost quadrupled within the past 15 years both as to the teaching staff and the enrollment of pupils.

Errors { The Act passed by the Legislature of Virginia was taken advantage of by the counties of Ohio, Brooke and Kanawha as to holding elections for the establishing of public schools. The latter two counties, however, did not carry out the will of the voters for some now unknown reason, and it remained for Ohio County to be

the only county at that time in Virginia, if not in the entire South, to have a public school system.

While each of the five wards of Wheeling by 1851 had a building, the adjacent territory did not, until a later date established schools, which later were added to the Independent School District, the Sixth Ward, Webster School in 1860, Madison in 1867, and Ritchie in 1871. The record of the founding of Webster and Madison Schools is meagre, containing only the date for formation.

The record, however, of Ritchie names the first Commissioners as Dr. Robert W. Hazlett, George Bowers, and Charles Otto, with H. N. Mertz as Principal with five assistants.

From 1865 and on for a few years Fulton was embraced in the Wheeling District, but was later transferred to Washington Country District as at present.

Succession of Officers of the Board of Education

The following named gentlemen acted as President, Clerk and Superintendent respectively of the Board of Education. The usual term of each was and is at present, two years:

Up to 1865, the general management of the schools rested with the Board of Education acting through the Principal as executive officers. Adopting the method then coming in vogue in other schools, provision was made for a Superintendent of Schools, and accordingly on August 2, 1865, Mr. (T) S. Williams was elected Superintendent at a salary of \$1,000.00 per annum with the provision that "he engage in no other calling or occupation."

Several motions were made as to the salary, the amounts ranging from \$350.00 to \$1,500.00 per annum. The Principals at this time were receiving \$1,000.00 and the teachers from \$300.00 to \$400.00 for the ten months service and the clerk \$60.00 per annum.

Superintendent Williams served until 1875, voluntarily resigning. He was succeeded by John C. Hervey, who served until 1881, dying in office. John M. Birch was his successor but resigned in 1885, having accepted a Consulship to Nagasaki, Japan. W. H. Anderson, then Principal of Union School, became Superintendent, which he held until 1903, when he retired voluntarily after 18 years service. Then followed D. W. Cloyd, resigning in November, 1904, and succeeded by H. B. Work, who resigned in 1914 to accept the Superintendency of Schools of Lancaster, Pa. Mr. Work was succeeded by the present incumbent, C. E. Githens.

Lincoln (Colored) School

A school for the colored children was established in 1866 in a building on Twelfth Street. This building was known as the Madison Township School and was attended by children of the Second Ward and the Island.

A building being built in 1866 on the Island on North York Street near Zane, the Island pupils were transferred to this building and the colored school occupied the building thus vacated.

In 1875 this Twelfth Street building was sold and one provided for school use on the site of the present building. This building was destroyed by fire in 1893 and the one now in use was erected, which with additions made to it and further room being provided by the purchase of a building adjacent, furnishes room not only for ordinary school use but also rooms for Manual Training, Home Economics and Medical Inspection.

The first Principal of this school was John W. West at a salary of \$500.00 for the school year of ten months. Although named Principal, he was the only teacher for seven years, when in 1873 he was given an assistant. There are now 14 teachers in the Elementary and High School Departments of this school, and pupils from adjacent communities, constituting about 15 per cent. of the enrollment are admitted, the Boards of Education of their respective School Districts paying their tuition.

The High School is rated as first class and its graduates are admitted to institutions of higher learning on diploma.

It is interesting to note that this school was established a few months before the 14th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States was adopted, this amendment giving the negro the right of citizenship.

Public Library

The Public Library of the City of Wheeling in 1882 passed from other management to that of the Board of Education, a provision being made in amendment to the school charter to levy not more than three cents on the \$100.00 valuation of both personal property, real estate and public utilities for its maintenance. The Library having been conducted for many years in various rented quarters the Board in January, 1910, adopted plans for a building on the site of the original High School building. The building was accepted from the contractors as completed November 17, 1910. In addition to its being a source of great benefit to the community, it affords by reason of its close proximity to the High School building, a most excellent opportunity to the High School pupils for reference and research work. To such an extent is this carried out both by the High Schools and also by the Elementary Schools, the Library is really a part of the school system, the Board of Education providing for its maintenance and the Superintendent of Schools being ex-officio Superintendent. At present there are 40,906 volumes, 29 daily newspapers, 94 magazines and numerous house organs for the free use of patrons of the Independent School District, others pay \$1.00 annually for the privilege of taking out books, the newspapers and periodicals being of free access to anyone but not taken from the building.

Industrial Education

In January, 1907, Manual Training classes under private management were established in Union School building on Saturday forenoons and were attended by boys of the upper grades of that school.

Equipment for Woodwork, Mechanical Drawing and an Instructor from the Pittsburgh Schools had been furnished by a generous private citizen, the Board of Education providing the room and the necessary light and heat. Shortly after and under the same conditions a class in Home Economics was established in the same building, the expense of equipment, material and instruction being met by the Woman's Club of the city. These classes were made up of girls of the upper grades in Union School.

On June 9, 1907, the value of these activities being recognized by the Board, both classes were adopted by the Board, extra equipment added, an instructor for each department secured and the classes were open to all pupils of the seventh and eighth grades and such High School pupils as would elect the work.

This department has grown from one shop and one teacher each for Manual Training and Home Economics until now there are six centers for each of these activities and 23 instructors, while the pursuit of each is required of all pupils in grades 5, 6, 7, 8 and the first year in the High School, the boys taking Manual Training and the girls Home Economics. The shops in Manual Training are: Planing Mill, Wood Turning and Pattern Making, Blue Printing, Mechanical Drawing, Sheet Metal, Cabinet Making, Forging, Chipping and Filing, or Acetylene Welding, Electrical Construction, Pottery and Machine Shop, while Home Economics consists of Sewing, Fitting, Designing, Cooking and Dietetics.

Medical Inspection

Medical Inspection was introduced in the schools at the opening of school in September, 1912. A physician to conduct examinations and a registered nurse to assist him were provided. As the great importance of this work was soon recognized as demanding more attention than could be given with this meagre force, nurses were added from time to time until at present the Elementary Schools maintain a staff of six nurses and the High School a teacher devoting her entire time to instruction in the laws of health.

The children under the direction of the Medical Inspector are examined annually, weighed monthly and report sent to the parents.

Nutrition classes, using the Emerson Method are conducted in each school building.

Physical Education

Although physical exercises had been held daily in all the school rooms for quite a number of years under the direction of the teachers who were furnished a text for such work, Physical Educa-

tion as a part of the course was not recognized until 1916, by the appointment of a committee of seven members to report as to its adoption. A favorable report was made and in September, 1917, Physical Education was introduced in the schools, under the charge of a director and an assistant. It was soon observed that this force was insufficient to carry on the work and three assistants were added.

Seeing the necessity of athletic grounds the Board of Education prepared a bill asking permission to purchase ground not to exceed ten acres within the city limits. This bill passed in 1919 and the present Public School Athletic Field, containing five acres, was purchased and equipped by the opening of school in September, 1920.

The schools were reorganized in 1874, provision being made in the last four years of the 12 year course for a High School Course, and the first class was graduated in 1878, each of the seven schools having member of this class. This course obtained until 1897, when the present High School was established as previously mentioned. From 1878 to 1897 there were 796 graduates and from 1897 to date 1,301 graduates, a total of 2,097, to which is to be added 93 as having graduated from Lincoln (colored) High School, which was established in 1900, making a grand total of 2,190 graduates.

The study of Music, although obtaining since the formation of the schools, was not supervised until 1889, when a Supervisor was elected, and this feature has grown into favor and prominence as attested by the very good results.

A Supervisor of Drawing was chosen in 1905 and in 1915 a Supervisor of Penmanship. The success that has attended the work of these departments has amply justified their establishment.

Survey

The United States Bureau of Education at the request of the Board of Education conducted a Survey of the schools in 1921, and made several recommendations which are being carried out from time to time. Among these was the reduction of the Board membership to five members, elected at large and on a non-partisan ticket; requiring all new teachers graduating from a first class High School and supplemented by graduation in a standard course in an accredited Teacher Training School; a change in the system of accounting and the election of a business manager; giving the Superintendent of Schools exclusive power in the appointment of all employees but subject to confirmation by the Board of Education; a building program which is now being carried out in the pro-

posed new building in Ritchie District and the adoption of the plan of establishing two Junior High Schools as soon as conveniently possible.

As the charter of the Independent School District of Wheeling contained a section in which it was stated that the School Code of West Virginia should not be applicable to the Wheeling School District, the Board from time to time presented certain bills to the State Legislature, the following named ones being enacted:

In 1905 a Compulsory Attendance Law requiring the school attendance of youth from their seventh year to and including their fourteenth year.

A Teachers' Retirement Fund to which both Board and teachers contribute, was instituted in 1917 through State legislation, the only fund of this kind in the State.

Interspersed in the minutes mention is made of some quaint incidents, not devoid of humor, among which is the following under the date of January 28, 1868:

"Principalreported the case offor having insulted his teacher Miss....., on the street calling her 'squint eye' and making use of other opprobrious epithets. This lad, last term, resisted the Principal, striking him on the head with a fire poker, cutting an ugly gash. Rather than undertake to inflict punishment in this instance the boy was referred to the Superintendent."

Full accounts occupying over 100 pages were given of all cases of disciplining pupils who left the school under censure. Ordinarily such pupils were readmitted upon apologizing for their conduct.

In notifying the Board the results of a Teachers' Examination on School Government, held August 8, 1867, the Superintendent reported:

"The answers given by several of the candidates were, in the main, intelligible and correct. The attempts of others, however, were in many respects awkward, clumsy and often ludicrous, evincing extreme ignorance and thoughtlessness upon the subject. It was quite apparent the examination upon this subject was not anticipated."

In answering the question "Give your opinion of rewards as an incentive to study," the Superintendent quotes Terrence in the original. "Pudore et liberalitate liberos retinere, satius esse credo, quam metu" or "I believe children are more easily controlled through kindness and firmness than through fear."

The following account of the observance of the Fourth of July, 1850, displays the patriotism of that period:

"The several ward schools, at an early hour, met at their respective school houses and repaired in processions to the Market Square, where they were formed in procession by James S. Wheat, Esq., Chief Marshal, assisted by his Deputy Marshal, and after marching through the principal streets of the city, repaired to the M. E. Church, where they together with a large concourse of citizens and strangers were highly entertained by listening to an interesting address from Professor Murry of Washington and a poem delivered by A. B. Clark, Esq., of this city, and the very interesting manner in which the scholars executed the singing, led by Mr. A. I. Hale, after which they were dismissed and all returned to their homes with the gratification of knowing that for once they had participated in celebrating our national anniversary in a rational and most interesting manner. May it long be remembered by those who were present on the occasion."

In conclusion we feel proud of the fact that this community was among the very first in the old South to see the great importance of public education, and having this vision, set about by appropriate legislation to secure for the youth that which is preeminently required of the citizens of a representative form of government, namely, such a training as makes for sane and intelligent citizenship. A training that has been so gradually extending in scope that we can safely predict for the future school, one that will give equal opportunity to all to develop their God-given talent, not only along, as largely at present is the condition, academic lines but along those that furnish him, at least, apprenticeship in whatever vocation to which he is adapted. Such a school, the present one plus industrial education, is occupying the attention not only of educators, but of the business world, for it is realized, as Dr. Elliott, President Emeritus of Harvard University, says, "The combination of bookwork with shopwork is the nearest to perfect education that the world has ever seen."
